## WATER AND SEWER RATES IN EASTERN PRAIRIE TOWNSHIP

Eastern Prairie Township is home to most of the Franklin County Engineering Department's (FCSED) customers, but its sewer and water lines are scattered throughout the County. This means that, as well as the fact that the system's facilities are aging and otherwise difficult to maintain, it is a very costly operation. This situation is the result of a number of causes that evolved over time. A recent study conducted for the FCSED concluded that this operation is not sustainable from a business/cost perspective. The study recommended that it be merged into a larger neighboring system to cure its financial woes. The Board of Trustees, which has been engaged in this issue since 2012, is an active advo-

cate for this solution and has reached out to Franklin County, City of Columbus and State officials to urge that this move forward. In the meantime, Franklin County is limiting volume-based rate increases to passing through Columbus increases (as opposed to the much larger increases that would be necessary to cover costs), but the \$101.91 per quarter base fee is still much higher than elsewhere and appears to be growing. Residents are always encouraged to discuss their concerns with the Board of Trustees, but this is no substitute for reaching out to the individuals that can have a real impact on rates. If you are interested in this issue please reach out to your county and state elected

officials. Feel free to contact the Township office if you require assistance in obtaining contact information for any of these officials.

## DO NOT KNOCK REGISTRY

The Board of Trustees adopted HR No. 02-17 establishing a "Do Not Knock" Registry, effective March 31, 2017.

Prairie Township residents can sign up for the registry on the Townships website, or in person at the Township Hall located at 23 Maple Drive.

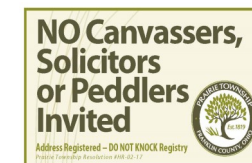
Once a household is registered,

they will receive a window/door sticker to display, which notifies all door-to-door vendors (with the exception of non-profit organizations) that they are on the registry.

- All door-to-door salespersons must obtain a transient vendor permit from our office. They should always display a photo ID badge on a Prairie Township lanyard.
- Residential uses shall place all trash, garbage, and solid waste in enclosed containers. Please do not place your containers at the road right-of-way prior to 24 hours before regularly scheduled trash pick-up.

### Street Sweeping

There will be two regular neighborhood street sweeps this year, the week of April 17 and the week of September 5th (weather permitting). We will start in the eastern portion of the township and work towards the west. Please remove any vehicles from street to allow us to thoroughly clean the gutter area in front of the curb.

Street sweeps along W. Broad Street between I-270 and Hilliard-Rome Road will take place monthly beginning in April.

We do not currently know which roads will be included in this year's road resurfacing project.

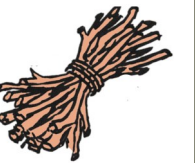
Once the determination is made, residents in the effected areas will be notified via postcard.

The guidelines for curbside chipping are available on the townships website, or by calling the Department.

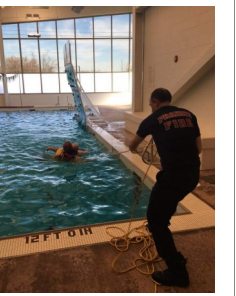

## FIRE DEPARTMENT



On Friday February 10th, the Prairie Township Fire Department conducted water rescue training in the swimming pool at the Prairie Township Community Center. The purpose of the training was to familiarize members with the use of exposure suites, rope throw bags, and water rescue techniques. The following week, the same training was conducted, along with other area departments, in a local pond. Water rescue skills are essential to the operations of all Central Ohio Fire Departments due to the extensive amount of lakes, ponds, rivers, and streams in the area. Fortunately, these skills are not often used by local first responders. This same fact however, greatly increases the value of high quality training.
